Gastritis

What is it?

- Inflammation irritation of the stomach lining
- **<u>Stomach</u>** can tolerate strong acid
- <u>Acute Stress Gastritis</u>- most severe, caused by severe or sudden injury
 - Example- Severe Burns, Major Bleeding, Trauma- small bruises develop in stomach lining turn to ulcers, start to bleed, black tarry stools, blood pressure falls
- <u>Atropic Gastritis</u>- antibodies attack the stomach lining, looses cells that produce acid, seen in elderly or having part of the stomach removed, can cause pernicious anemia, malabsorption of B12
- <u>Bacterial Gastritis</u>- infection by helicobacterpylori organism (bacteria that grow in the stomach lining (mucus secreting cells)
 - Other Bacteria- can develop if no acid is present causing temporary/persistent gastritis
- <u>Chronic Erosive Gastritis</u>- irritants as drugs, aspirin, (NSAID's) nonsteroid antiinflammatory drugs, viral or bacterial infection, Crohn's Disease, alcohol abuse- ulcers develop- nausea, pain in upper abdomen, can develop stomach ulcers, black tarry stools (melena), vomiting blood
- <u>Eosinophilic Gastritis</u>- allergic reaction to ringworm infestation, white blood cells (WBC's) accumulate in the stomach wall- vomiting, abdominal pain, blocking or narrowing of the duodenum
- Fungal or Viral Gastritis- impaired immune system, prolonged illness
- Menetrier Gastritis- stomach walls become thick, fluid filled cyst
 - 10% develop stomach cancer- stomach pain, edema due to loss of protein in the inflamed stomach lining
- <u>Plasma Cell Gastritis</u>- WBC's (White Blood Cells) plasma accumulate in the stomach walls/organs- vomiting, abdominal pain, diarrhea, skin rash
