
# **Narcotic Addiction**

#### What is it?

- Narcotic Addiction a strong psychological and physical dependence
- <u>Compulsion</u>- to the continued use of narcotics
- <u>Dosage</u>- must be increased to get the same effect and to prevent withdrawal

## What are the powerful drugs?

- <u>Powerful Drugs</u>- Opioids, osycodonemeperidine, morphine, hydromorphone
- Heroin- one of the strongest narcotics, illegal in the US



### Facts:

- <u>Narcotics</u>- given for pain often cause constipation, so increase Fiber and Fluids
  - See FFF Fiber, See FFF Fluids
- <u>Symptoms</u>- Flushed skin, low blood pressure, itching, constricted pupils,
  slow shallow breathing, drowsiness, slow heart rate, low body temperature
- <u>First withdrawal Symptoms</u>- yawning, rapid breathing, perspiration, crying, and a runny nose
- Other symptoms gooseflesh, tremors, muscle twitching, aching muscles. hot and cold flashes, diarrhea, loss of appetite, gastrointestinal cramps
- Symptoms- may occur 4 to 6 hours after the narcotic is stopped
- Peak Time 36 to 72 hours
- <u>Withdrawal</u>- worse in people who have used larger amounts for longer periods of time
- <u>Shared Needles</u>- increases chances of viral hepatitis, liver damage, bone infections, HIV, skin sores, lung problems, neurologic problems, severe infections and many other problems

### What do I need to do?

- See a Health Care Provider
- Follow the Medication Prescription as directed by your Health Care Provider and there is little risk of becoming addicted
