Otalgia- Ear Pain

What is it?

• <u>Ear Pain</u> – may be in the inner, middle or outer ear, mild or severe pain, may be caused by an infection, trauma or blockage of the ear



<u>Causes of Ear Pain</u>- trauma to the ear as using cotton swabs, change in pressure blockage related to earwax or a foreign object, swimmer's ear. Infection in the inner ear, a bacterial infection to the bone behind the ear, ruptured eardrum, allergic reaction, tooth abscess, sinusitis, sore throat, tumors of the ears disorder of the inner ear/Meniere's disease, TMJ/temporomandibular joint syndrome

Signs and Symptoms:

- <u>Ear Pain</u>- pain, ringing in the ears, fever, vomiting, headache, itching, pain in the jaw or sinuses, drainage hearing impairment, dizziness, vertigo,
 - o Check out- medications, herbals, medical problems

Recommendations:

• <u>Treatment</u>- eardrops, heat, antibiotics, surgery; if cancer- surgery, chemotherapy, radiation wit side effects of bleeding, infection and allergic reactions

Facts:

- **<u>Risk to Others</u>** only if strep throat, otherwise not contagious
- Long-Term Effects
 - usually none but may require surgery and medications
 for a long time

What can I do?

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- See your Health Care Provider for more information
 - Diagnosis and Tests- look at the ear with an otoscope, may do a hearing test based on medical history and exam, blood tests may be ordered if an infection, blood cultures, x-rays, cranial CT scans
 - Prevention- avoid trauma and loud noises, seek early care for upper respiratory infections, if swimming wear ear plus, do not use cotton swabs in the ear
